Report on the Spring Show

The Kimble and Ellesborough Horticultural Society Spring Show was held in the Stewart Hall, Little Kimble on Sunday 7th April. There were 139 exhibits on the benches provided by 15 members; some of these were members new to the Society and showing for their first time. The competition was very close with only a few points separating the winners, from the runners-up for many trophies. Sue Towersey won the Spring Challenge Cup, for the most points in the Show, as well as best domestic exhibit, David Ridgway won the Wingletang Trophy, for the most points in the bulb classes, as well as the Pot Plant Trophy. Dee Floyd won the Ray Taylor Cup for Sweet Preserves; Mary Redding won the Open Floral Art class. Graham Talbot exhibit of three small cup daffodils was awarded best in show. The Shefford brothers Kieran and Oliver both won first prizes in the junior classes. Great Kimble school entered for the first time also gaining a first for their joint effort. A large number of visitors viewed the Show during the afternoon, many partaking of the cakes and tea which did a roaring trade.

Summer Evening Visit to Kingsbridge Farm Tuesday 2nd July 2019 at 6 00 pm

This year we are visiting a very special garden which has come highly recommended and, although it is a little further away, it will be well worth a visit.

Description of the gardens

This stunning established 6 acre garden is the product of 30 years of care and dedication by the current owners. The main lawn is enclosed by softly curving herbaceous borders leading on past clipped yews, some topiary, a semi-circle of pleached hornbeam and out across the haha to the countryside beyond. The garden is interestingly planted throughout with winding paths which pass a gazebo, rose arbour, shrubs and roses. A natural stream, containing bog plants and the home of kingfishers, meanders through woodland gardens with many walks and a choice of bridges to cross. This is a garden to visit again and again which is always evolving.

Refreshments, including tea and cakes, will be served.

The admission charge is normally £6 per head plus £3.50 for refreshments.

The cost to members is only £7.50


